

Galloway Road speed zone

In 1978, the Board of Commissioners approved two temporary speed-zone orders that reduced the speed limit on Galloway Road to 35 mph due to the road's poor condition.

When the Sandlake-Galloway Road Project was completed in 2005, Galloway Road was entirely reconstructed. Given the improved road conditions, the Tillamook County Road Department requested the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Traffic Section to conduct an investigation of Galloway Road to determine the appropriate speed zone for this road. Results of the ODOT investigation were recently received. ODOT recommended removing the temporary 35 mph speed zone and returning the speed of the road to its original approved speed zone of 45 mph.

May 16, the Board of Commissioners signed an order rescinding the 1978 temporary speed zone orders. The Road Department crew will modify the road speed zone signs in the near future.
