

CHAINS

RESTORED CORNER FOR OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY

One quarter corner common to Sections 13 and 24,
T.2S, R.7W., W.M., Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL

Post, (now missing), L.H.L. Lumber Corp. 3/4" iron pipe and
cap found in place, from which a:

- 14" Hemlock bears S81°W 45 lks.; now 15" uproot,
part of scribes BT remaining, root hole in place.
- 9" Hemlock bears S51°E 36 lks.; now 9" uproot,
badly rotted, root hole in place.

RESTORED

Drove above 3/4" galvanized iron pipe with 2 1/2" bronze cap
marked "L.H.L. Lumber Corp. 1/4 cor. 13,24,T2S R7W 1954",
into within 3 inches of ground, in mound of stone, and
from which a:

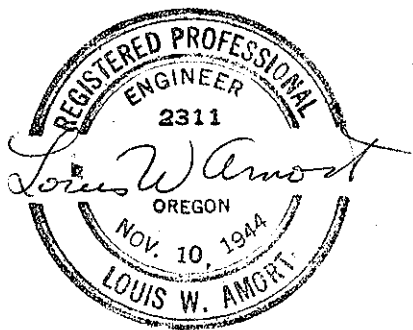
- 46" Fir stump bears S25°W 15.6 ft.; scribed 1/4 S24 BT RE 2311.
- 54" Fir stump bears N53°E 40.2 ft.; scribed 1/4 S13 BT.

Set 3"x3"x72" white painted Cedar post 2 ft. SW of pipe.
Oregon State Board of Forestry metal location poster on
54" Fir stump BT.

Also poster on 3"x3"x72" white painted Cedar post 1050 ft.
East on South edge R.R. grade.
