

Survey for the Oregon State Board of Forestry

Restoration of monument to the 1/4 section corner to Sections 13 and 14,
Township 1 North, Range 6 West, N.M.

The point for the corner determined by the remains of the original bearing
trees:

A hemlock stump 24 inches in diameter with the scribe 1/4 S plainly
visible, bears North 55° East a distance of 19.1 feet (29 lks).

A hemlock stub 28 inches in diameter with the face grown over (not
cut out) bears South 78° West a distance of 21.8 feet (33 lks).

At the point for corner

Set a 1½ inch iron pipe, 3 feet long, filled with charcoal with an Oregon
State Board of Forestry bronze cap stamped 1/4 S 14 S 13, 1950, 199

from which:

A fir stump 50 inches in diameter, bears North 23° West a distance
of 26.0 feet, scribed 1/4 S 14, 199

A metal location poster on a fir snag 20 inches in diameter bears
South 8° East, a distance of 33.4 feet

Placed a mound of stones, 2 feet base, 1 foot high around the pipe.
