

BOUNDARY SURVEY

SECTIONS 16 & 21, T2N, R7W, W.M.

TILLAMOOK COUNTY

June, 1957

June 6, 1957, with Rob't. L. McCullough, at the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between sections 16 & 21, T2N, R7W, W.M. I find a small hemlock stump bearing a cruiser's tag. Beside the stump I find a fragment from the stump bearing the original letters "BT".

Thirty-nine feet from the stump at S 69° E I find a 6" square post 6' long which I replace with a $\frac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe 30" long set 20" in the ground from which I mark new BT's as follows:

A fir stump 46" diameter bears N 12° W 8.8 feet marked ~~MMN~~ $\frac{1}{4}$ S16 BT.

A fir stump 36" diameter bears N 86° W 22.2 feet marked 322 1957 $\frac{1}{4}$ BT.

Both trees fall in section 16, there being no sound stumps within a reasonable distance in section 21.

The call to the spring branch west chains 65 feet shorter than given; and the call to the creek east chains 55 feet longer than given.

June 6, 1957 at the vicinity of the corner to sections 15, 16, 21, & 22, T2N, R7W, W.M. I find a galvanized iron pipe bearing an Oregon State Board of Forestry brass cap from which new BT's are blazed south and west, the westerly tree having been uprooted by recent logging. I find no original evidence of the corner.

June 7, 1957 From the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between sections 16 & 17, T2N, R7W, W.M. I chain south by compass for the corner to sections 16, 17, 20 & 21, T2N, R7W, W.M. I place a temporary stake 129 feet north of the brook, Cs E-W described in the original description, this being the nearest call.

From the temporary post I chain S 80° E by compass for the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between sections 16 & 21, T2N, R7W, W.M. At 2975.5 feet I fall 65 feet north of the corner.

June 10, 1957, from the temporary post I chain west on compass for the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between sections 17 & 20, T2N, R7W, W.M. At station 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ 15 I find an old line blaze, reopened since the death of the tree, 26.5 feet south of my line. I fall 20 feet north and 56 feet east of the first two calls out of the temporary post. I do not find the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner.

June 11, 1957, I place a second temporary post 56 feet west and 26.5 feet south of the first and chain south. I search along the line diligently for 1500 feet but fail to find any evidence of old line blazes.

Thirty feet east of the second temporary post I find a 16" hemlock lying on its side with blazes on the east and west sides. It is impossible to find the spot from which this tree came. The blazes were made before the tree died, being partially grown over.
