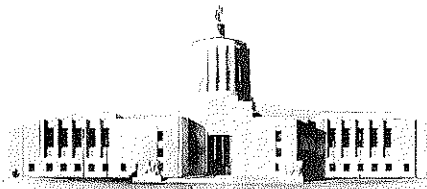

Subject: Survey of Boundary,
Oswald West State Park

As per your request of December 14, you
will find enclosed:

1. A deed description of the right-of-way tract for the road running from the Oregon Coast Highway, in Section 20, Township 3 North, Range 10 West, northerly to the north line of Section 20, where it enters Section 17. As you will note in the deed, the right-of-way is 60 feet wide instead of 50 feet as per the Tillamook County Assessor's maps.

2. A copy of our field notes for the re-setting and rewitnessing of the quarter corner between Sections 17 and 20, Township North, Range 10 West, Willamette Meridian.

3. An Oregon State Highway Department boundary map which shows the quarter corner about 50 feet east of the right-of-way in question.
