No scribe shows. Not entirely convinced that this is the original bearing tree for this section corner, I begin at

range line to verify the evidence at Section corner ^{21 19} T. 1 N., R's 9 & 10 W. Checking with the original field notes in retracing the range line I find the creek and ridge ties in accord with those described in the original field notes. Proceeding north to the approximate position of the section corner I find the hemlock stub to be on the original range line. The position of this evidence is further verified by the stream tie to Moss Creek approximately 100 feet north of the position of the stream.

I am firmly convinced that this hemlock stub is the remains of the original bearing tree marked by the original land surveyors in 1873. I am certain beyond any doubt that restoring this corner from this evidence will place this corner in the original position and that a restoration of this corner by any other method would result in this corner being erroneously set. From this bearing tree I set a 3" x 3" x 36" cedar post for the corner as per distance and bearing as recorded in the original field notes. This corner was referenced as follows:
