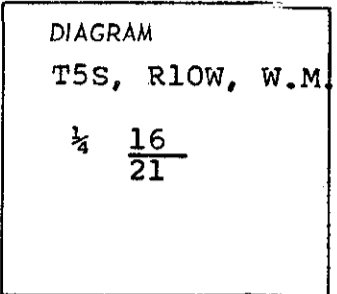
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

(Reference FSH 5681.65)

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was established in 1882 by General Land Office (William P. Wright, surveyor).

It was reestablished in 1956 by John C. Carlich (ORLS 287)



Description of corner evidence found:

Found $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch by 24 inch iron pipe for $\frac{1}{4}$ corner to Sections 16 and 21 with a 4 x 4 x 48 inch wooden post alongside pipe.

From which:

A fir, 14 inches in diameter bears N6 $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 61.4 feet distance

A hemlock, 12 inches in diameter bears due west, 46.7 feet slope distance

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At the corner point set a 2 inch by 30 inch cement filled iron pipe with a brass cap marked

T5S R10W

From which:

An alder, 14 inches in diameter bears S85 $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 17.9 feet distance

Bark Scribed N $\frac{1}{4}$ S 21 BT

An alder, 18 inches in diameter bears S56 $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 55.4 feet distance

Bark Scribed N $\frac{1}{4}$ S 21 BT

Deposited iron pipe and wooden post beside the monument.

U.S.F.S. bearing tree signs were placed on all BT's facing the monument
