

RESTORED CORNER FOR STATE OF OREGON—DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY

One-Quarter corner common to Sections 31 and 36, Township 2 North, Ranges 9 and 10 West, Willamette Meridian, Tillamook County, Oregon.

CHAINS

ORIGINAL

No evidence of original corner found.

RESTORATION by W. A. Markham (no date - between September and April, 1951.)

Iron pipe (missing) from which a:

50" Hemlock bears N 52 E 10.8 ft.; now 60" stump, scribes 1/4 S31 BT visible.

24" Hemlock bears S 84 W 21.5 ft.; now 30" snag, scribes 1/4 S31 BT visible on partly grown over face.

RESTORED

Var 21° 30' E

Set 1 1/2" x 36" galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap marked "OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY 1/4 S36 S31 1968 RS 707", 30 inches in ground, and from which a:

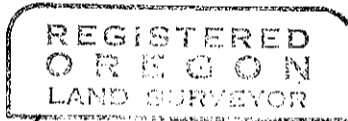
27" Hemlock bears S 80 E 39.6 ft.; scribed 1/4 S31 BT RS 707.

48" Hemlock bears S 29 W 31.9 ft.; scribed 1/4 S36 BT.

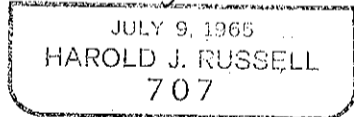
Set 4" x 4" x 60" white painted Cedar post 1.0 ft. NW of corner pipe. Oregon State Forestry Department metal location poster on 9" Hemlock S 56 W 20.9'.

Section corner common to Sections 33, 34, 4 and 3, Townships 3 and 4 South, Range 7 West, Willamette Meridian, Tillamook County, Oregon.

CHAINS

ORIGINAL

Stone 15" x 10" x 8" (in place, 3 notches on East edge).

No bearing trees marked.

RESTORED

Var 21½ E

Marked X in top of orig. stone in mound of rock, and from which a:

14" Fir bears S 14 W 23.0 ft.; scribed T4S R7W S4 BT RS 707.

18" Fir bears N 6¼ E 38.0 ft.; scribed T3S R7W S34 BT.

8" Fir bears N 56 W 35.6 ft.; scribed T3S R7W S33 BT.

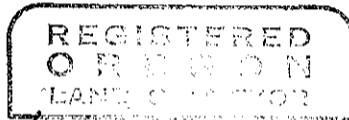
16" Fir bears S 40 E 22.1 ft.; scribed T4S R7W S3 BT.

Set 4" x 4" x 66" Fir post 1.4 ft. SE of corner stone.

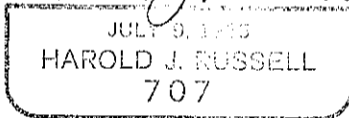
