One-Quarter corner common to Sections 23 and 24, Town-  
ship 2 North, Range 10 West, Willamette Meridian,  
Tillamook County, Oregon.

CHAINS

ORIGINAL

Post (missing, found 1 1/4" iron pipe in place) from which a:

10" Alder bears N 60 W 5 lks.; missing.

10" Hemlock bears S 60 E 5 lks.; missing.

Very old rail fence runs West and South from pipe.

See affidavit dated June 6, 1968. Fence described in affidavit  
has since been destroyed.

Var. 21 1/2 E

Set 1 1/2" x 36" galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap marked  
"OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY 1/4 S23 S24 1968 RS 707",  
in place of above 1 1/4" iron pipe, and from which a:

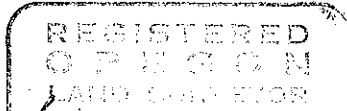
42" Hemlock bears N 69 1/2 W 41.5 ft.; scribed 1/4 S23 BT.

33" Hemlock bears S 54 E 16.2 ft.; scribed 1/4 S24 BT RS 707.

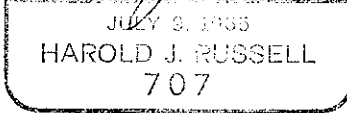
Set 4" x 4" x 48" white painted Cedar post 1.0 ft. NE of corner pipe.

CHAINS

Witness Point (Line Tree) common to Sections 4 and 9, Township 3 South, Range 8 West, Willamette Meridian, Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL

34" Fir line tree at 4.08 chains West of the 1/4 corner common to Sections 4 and 9 (now 72" snag 18' tall, 3 notches on West 3 notches on East sides).

WITNESSED

Var  $21\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E

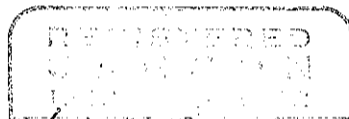
26" Fir bears S 43 W 26.2 ft.; scribed W P S9 BT RS 707.  
19" Fir bears N 7 W 31.3 ft.; scribed W P S4 BT.

One quarter corner common to Sections 4 and 9 bears N  $85^{\circ} 20'$  54" E 213.3 ft.

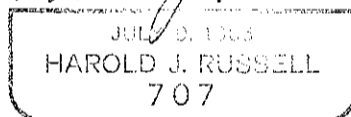
