Dear Tom:

From the GLO notes I have on hand, I can furnish you the history of the corners in question. I can give you some of my evaluations and opinions but it is entirely your judgment to accept or reject these section corners.

Referring to the history of the N.E. township corner of T. 4 S., R. 9 W. as on record:

Henry Meldrum under GLO contract, September 13, 1878, began at the corner to T. 4-5 S., R. 8-9 W. and surveyed north along the east boundary of T. 4 S., R. 9 W.

Setting $\frac{1}{4}$ and section corners to a point for the corner to T. 3-4 S., R. 8-9 W. in question.

May 15, 1879, he surveyed the north boundary of T. 4 S., R. 9 W. setting $\frac{1}{4}$ and section corners.

Samuel Caudle under GLO contract, August 1880, for the purpose of subdividing T. 3 S., R. 9 W. proceeded to the N.E. corner of T. 4 S., R. 9 W. and after a diligent search could not find it. He then went to the N.W. corner of T. 4 S., R. 9 W. and upon finding the township corner he retraced east on Meldrum's old line.

Caudle states that "as this township line forms the base of my work I find some of the old corners in such position that to enable me to close my surveys of subdividion within limits I have to set some new corners."

At the point for the ½ corner to Section 35 on the township line T. 3 S., R. 9 W., Caudle states, "Being unable to find any trace of the old line further, I run on same course." He set corners ancluding the corner to T. 3-4 S., R. 8-9 W.
