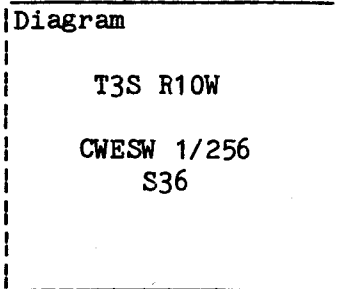


History of original corner establishment

In 1965, Harold J. Russell, LS 707 (C.S. B-505), set a brass cap monument, from which:
16" Fir bears S09°E, 10.0 ft.
26" Fir bears N23°W, 4.8 ft.



In 1982, Edgar R. Cook, LS 1073 (C.S. B-1046), found the Oregon State Board of Forestry brass cap monument, from which:
16" Fir stump bears S09°E, 10.7 ft. (rec: 10.0 ft.), w/ a healed blaze.
24" Fir stump bears N23°W, 5.7 ft. (rec: 4.8 ft.), w/ a healed blaze.

He marked new bearing trees:
22" Fir bears S25°W, 37.8 ft., scribed "CWESW 1/256 S36 BT".
28" Fir bears S86°W, 27.3 ft., scribed "CWESW 1/256 S36 BT".
(NOTE: Brass cap is incorrectly stamped "C-E-W-SW 1/256").

Description of corner evidence found

At the corner point, I found an Oregon State Board of Forestry brass cap monument, marked as shown:

S36
C-E-W-SW
1/256
1965 RS707

From which the following references:
25" Fir stump, 4-ft. high, bears N23°W, 5.7 ft., w/ healed blaze.
15" Fir stump, bears S12°E, 10.5 ft. (rec: S09°E, 10.7 ft.), w/ healed blaze.
22" Fir bears S25°W, 37.8 ft., w/ healed blaze.
27" Fir bears S86°W, 27.3 ft., w/ healed blaze.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

I establish the following new references:
5/8" x 24" rebar bears N78-1/2°E, 156.5 ft. (also set a 5/8" rebar for a sight pin which bears N78-1/2°E, 84.7 ft. from the reference pin).
5/8" x 24" rebar bears N47-1/4°W, 158.1 ft. (also set a 5/8" rebar for a sight pin which bears N47-1/4°W, 64.6 ft. from the reference pin).

NOTE: This work was done at the request of the Hebo Ranger District, Siuslaw National Forest, because the existing monument and bearing trees will be disturbed by road and landing construction.
