

RESTORED CORNER FOR STATE OF OREGON - DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY

Section corner common to Sections 4, 5, 32 and 33, T2&3N, R7W, W.M., Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL by Henry Meldrum, September 2, 1891.

18"x9"x7" Basalt stone 12 inches in ground with 4 notches on East and 2 on West side; found, out of place.

- 5" Hemlock bears N42E 19 lks.; missing.
- 6" Maple bears S27E 53 lks.; missing, Vine Maple clump in vicinity.
- 4" Maple bears S78W 59 lks.; missing.
- 5" Hemlock bears N20W 17 lks.; missing.
- 20 lk. fork of Salmonberry, course North bears N89 55E 3.00 chains; Ripple creek in place.
- Leave bottom course North and South, bears S89 55W .50 chains; in place.

RESTORATION by Louis W. Amort RE2311, November 16, 1955 (Book 2, page 327, Tillamook County Records).

Erected mound of stone around corner stone; missing.

- 34" Maple bears N03 1/2E 114.6 ft.; now 40" face closed.
- 14" Maple bears S74W 61.7 ft.; now 29" face closed.
- 56" Fir stump bears N56W 42.4 ft.; now badly rotted with portions of scribes T3N R7W S32 BT visible.
- 64" Fir stump bears S02E 82.5 ft.; now badly rotted with faint portions of scribes visible.
- 4"x3"x72" white painted Cedar post 1.5 ft. SE of original stone; found out of place lying on ground.

RESTORED October 24, 1988

Var. 21 1/2 E

Set a 1 1/2"x30" Aluminum pipe with 3 3/4" cap, 26" in ground, in mound of stone, marked "STATE OF OREGON DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY T3N R7W S32 S33 S5 S4 T2N 1988 LS1998", placed corner stone 1.2 ft. West of pipe, and from which a:

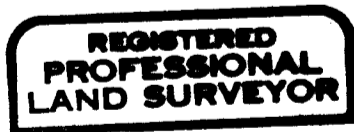
- 13" Alder bears N69W 34.3 ft. to barkscribes; T3NR7WS32BT.
- 11" Alder bears S10W 26.3 ft. to barkscribes; T2NR7WS4BT.

Reset white painted Cedar post N44E 2.3 ft. from corner pipe. Metal location poster on new BTs.

Also metal location poster on 34" and 14" Maple BTs.
