I found a 1 1/4" iron bar with a 3" Tillamook County Brass Cap (see T.C.S. Rewitness #385), approximately 2" deep and 7' East of the apparent centerline of Brick Yard County Road. I drove down to 6" deep and set an 8" cast iron monument case around the found monument and encased in concrete.

History of found monument

I found this monument to be as described in said T.C.S. Rewitness and the references found and/or set at that time to now be as follows:

Power Pole #16 P29-L30 West 29.35'; (Found, now 29.25' to a nail in a scribed triangle in the side center of the pole. The new pole number is #102700).

Power Pole #1 P29-L30R1 N.70*E. 56.55'; (Found, at bearing and distance to a nail in a scribed triangle in the side center of the pole. The new pole number is #103700).

96" hat section post S.58*E. 22.0'; (Now gone).

New Accessory

*72" Light Hat Section Post in Westerly Right of Way Fence S.54*W. 38.2'.

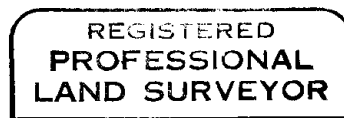
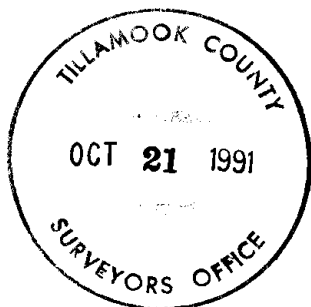
Location of Monument
