Item 1. Call Meeting to Order: Meeting called to order at 3:05 pm.

Item 2. Minutes Approval: A motion was made by Robert Garrigues to approve the January Minutes. The motion was seconded by Paul Daniels. The motion was carried unanimously.

Item 3. Budget: Ms. Welch presented the budget to the members in a PowerPoint presentation. Due to the December 2015 storm monies have already been expended. The hope is to get reimbursement from FEMA and FHWA. Members appreciated TCPW team for their hard work. Mr. Dove suggested that due to the condition of the buildings that an additional \$20,000 should be put in the building fund to be taken from asphalt. The members approved budget as amended.

Item 4. Draft paving list recommendation, add Kilchis River Road (culvert replacement 200 ft.): Ms. Welch handed out the draft paving list. The Beulah Reed residents present thanked Liane for putting it on the list. They suggested cold mix prior to paving since the pot holes are rather bad. Mr. Hall thanked CRAC and TCPW for the good work.

Item 5. December 2015 storm update (FEMA/FHWA): Ms. Welch said that the County Road transportation system repairs from the December 2015 amount to approximately \$8 M. Temporary repairs were necessary as culverts collapsed isolating communities and temporary bridges had to be placed. Staff is to meet with FEMA and FHWA in the next few weeks to discuss the projects. Ms. Welch presented a PowerPoint of the damages incurred throughout the county.

Item 6 – Capital Projects:

Wilson River Loop N-S: Ms. Welch reported that next to the vegetable stand flooding occurred. State Hwy 101 was closed so county flaggers monitored traffic throughout the night. Ms. Welch would like to discuss with FHWA the possibility of raising this road bearing in mind the hydrological effect of the property owners.

Resort Drive I & II: These projects will be going to construction summer/fall of 2016.

Goodspeed Bridge: With construction at a cost of \$80,000; this bridge is now opened.

Wyss Bridge: Contractor has some issues that need to be resolved.

Lommen Bridge: Construction is on schedule and within budget. There is a drainage issue with nearby property owner that Ms. Welch needs to find a solution. The second bridge that was supposed to have been built was for drainage and debris flow.

Whalen Island: Design is on schedule and budget.

Alternate Access @ Neskowin: Still looking for grant funding.

Cape Meares Loop Road: Ms. Welch reported that Ms. Steinbach will be writing a TIGER 6 grant to obtain \$6.1. \$6.5 million has already been obtained.

Item 7 – Road Maintenance Activities:

Tone Road: Road crew continuing to work on tide gates.

Potholes: Potholes are everywhere. The crew hopes to start patching as soon as the weather improves.

Vegetation Management: Ms. Welch is offering one of the crew an opportunity to train to learn this program. This is a good investment for TCPW.

Item 8 – OACES: Ms. Welch will be President next year.

Item 9. – Commissioner Labhart: Cape Meares Loop Road is a huge issue. During the December 2015 storm the community of Oceanside would have been isolated since OR State Hwy 131 was closed. Cape Meares Loop was opened flagged 24/7 since this is still an active slide area. Commissioner Labhart will seek support from Representative DeFazio and other politicians.
