From the corner to sections 52-53-5-4 on the line between townships 3 and 4 North, R. 6 W., previously described, we ran Southerly by traverse to the quarter corner between sections 5 and 4.

At a point 2151.9 ft. S. 0° 16' W. of the section corner, in a small area untouched by fire, we found an old 4"X 4" scribed stake still in place, and both original bearing trees at proper distances. Scribing shows plainly but both trees dead. We replace the stake with a 2"X 48" galv. iron pipe with brass cap on which is stamped a line with short cross mark and, circumferentially, 1/4 COR. T. & N. R. 6 W.W.M. - O.S.H.D? We also set a 4"X 4" white guard post stenciled 1/4 SEC. COR. on 2 faces in black, and marked 2 new bearing trees, as follows:

An 18" hemlock bears S. 11° W. 80.0 ft., scribed 1/4 S. B.T. A 14" cedar bears S. 38° E. 58.0 ft., scribed 1/4 S. B.T.
