RESTORED FOR OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY

Corner common to sections 3, 4, 33, 34, T. 1 & 2 N., R. 7 W., W.M., Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL

Post; now missing, from which a:

28" Hemlock bears N39E 73 lks; now 33" snag both faces. exposed and badly burnt; scribe mark T barely visible on lower face.

10" Hemlock bears N61W 81 1ks; now missing.

10" Hemlock bears S42E 431ks; now down 12" stub badly charred and out of place. Parts of the roots of this stub were found in place attached to a 5° fir stump; exposed scribe mark T.

4" Maple bears S9W 51 lks; now missing.

RESTORED CORNER AND BEARING TREES

Set $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap marked "OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY T2N R7W S33 S34 S4 S3 T1N 1952 2311", 2^{1}_{S} in ground, from which a:

- 6° Fir stump bears N75°30°W 34.6°; scribed T2N R7W S33
- 5' Fir stump bears N35E 89.3'; scribed T2N R7W S34 BT 2311.
- 5' Fir stump bears SLOE 69.3'; scribed TIN R7W S3 BT.

Placed an Oregon State Board of Forestry metal location poster on 33" Hemlock snag BT and marked it: Sec 34 T2N R7W Sec Cor 48.2' S39W.

Pipe is set under 4° fir log with X chopped in log above corner point.
