RESTORED CORNER FOR OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY

One-quarter corner common to sections 3 and 34, Tl and 2 N R7W, WM., Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL

Var. 22°E.

12"x10"x8" stone, now slightly out of place, marked #, from which a:

18" Hemlock bears N23E 38 lks; now 22" stub N27E, parts of scribe marks BT exposed.
30" Hemlock bears S28E 83 lks; now 48" rotted and burnt stub 12' high S24E 55.9°.

RESURVEY by Oregon State Board of Forestry February 20, 1951. Var. 18°E

12"236" galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap marked "OPEGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY 1/4 S34 S3 1951 199," now pulled up and laying on ground out of place.

44" Cedar snag bears N64W 71.5'; now down 44" snag, scribe marks 1/4 S BT 199 plainly visible.
29" Fir stub bears S61W 43.5'; now missing.

RESTORED CORNER AND WITNESSED CORNER POINT

Var. 220E

Reset 12"x36" galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap marked "OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY 1/4 S34 S3 1951 199," 22 in ground. Placed 1/4 corner stone on south edge of pipe and raised mound of stone around corner pipe, from which a:

60" Fir stump bears N45E 60.2'; scribed 1/4 S34 BT RE 2311.
50" Fir stump bears S60°30'W 88.9'; scribed 1/4 S3 BT.

Placed an Oregon State Board of Forestry metal location poster on 60° Fir stump BT and marked it: Sec 34 T2N R7W 1/4 Cor 60.2° S45W.
