Subdivision survey of Section 21, T5S, R10W, W. M., Tillamook County, Oregon

A portion of this survey was previously subdivided by John Carlich from 1956 to 1958. Corners established by Carlich, if adjacent to Forest Service Property, were remonumented. Corners found, restored, or reestablished by Markham in 1952, were also remonumented.

CS 1/16th, set by single proportionate measurement between the S $\frac{1}{4}$ corner and the Center $\frac{1}{4}$ corner.

SW 1/16th, set by intersection of east-west and north-south center lines of quarter section.

NW 1/16th, set by intersection of east-west and north-south center lines of quarter section.

A closed traverse was run from a point near the CS 1/16th corner Section 21, west to the approximate SW 1/16th corner, north to the CW 1/16th corner, west to the W ½ corner, south to the SW Section corner, then northeasterly to the point of beginning. A closed traverse was run from the CN 1/16th Section 21, to the N 1/16th between 20, 21, north to the NW Section corner, east to the N½ corners, then south to the point of beginning. Limit of closure did not exceed that as defined in Class D, Section 234 of the Manual of Surveying Instruction, 1947.
