

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTA

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was set originally by Caudle in 1880. He set a 10"X8"x8" stone and built a stone mound. In 1899 County Surveyor set a post and scribed 2 Alder B.T.S. Markham has tied to this corner but there is no record as to who set the axle

Description of corner evidence found:

a $1\frac{1}{2}$! axle driven beside a 12" x 10" x8" stone in a stone mound. Forest Service location poster on fence post. Monument approx 30 feet east of Wolf Creek at the end of an old fence running east. Caudle makes a creek call 1.5 chains west of corner but ground is flat and creek could have changed course

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

a 2" x 30" pipe with brass cap marked

Reset Axle beside pipe and reset stones
A 50" maple brs. N 16E 92 ft.
Bark scribed S22BT
A 20" Spruce brs. S8E 89⁰ ft.
Scribed S27BT
A 35" Spruc brs. S. 61W 105⁸ ft.
Scribed S28BT
A 18" Alder brs. N. 59W 73² ft.
Bark scribed T 3S R9W S21BT
Set steel fence post 3 ft. South of pipe with Attn. Sign facing east.
Placed B. T. tags on all B. T.'s
