1) In regard to  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner bet. 27-28  
I found a galv. pipe and old rotted post (on a mound of earth apparently made by the uprooting of a tree as in GLO records of Candler 1880). Noticing the healed over witness faces on two firs, I chopped one open finding the required scribe marks plus the scribes "CS". By counting the growth rings this scribing had previously been done about 12 or 14 years ago.

Assuming Billie Anderson, Tilla Co. surveyor had did this work, I inquired for information from John Carlick but he could not find Billie's record. Knowing Anderson scattered his records over all the Tilla Co. Courthouse I have hopes John can still come up with the records.

3)  $\frac{1}{4}$  between 26-27

a post was not on GLO records. at the corner point on old blazed line and the recorded distance from a cr.  $1\frac{3}{4}$  CHS. to the north I did not find the recorded stone but this solid pitch post lying upon the ground with faint  $\frac{1}{4}$ S scribed on its side. a string of old blazes run north to the next section corner where I found the proper dimensioned stone as on records with a solid pitch post lying at its base. This identical bit of evidence makes the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. post more substantial as evidence of cor. point
